Toronto Forklift Certification Schools - Within North America, forklift certification is mandatory, making forklift training programs important for both the company and their workers working as operators of forklifts. Forklift training focuses on health and safety issues included in making use of forklifts. Safety concerns affect both the operator of the forklift and workers and other people who are in the vicinity of the forklift. Businesses may be subject to penalties if they are caught with drivers who are un-certified during a check up. There are several compelling reasons why businesses should comply with forklift standards.

Most state, provincial and federal regulations require an employee evaluation of the skills essential for forklift safety before the employer signs off that the employee is certified. There are lots of ways to acquire forklift training for workers, like on-line forklift training. Nevertheless, employers must know that forklift certification training is not "just a test". Proper forklift training should consist of some areas of study, including theory and hands-on practice. Rules do not need employers to have an outside organization to certify forklift operators.

The recommended curriculum for a quality forklift certification service includes both classroom training and an on-site component. Classroom training normally features informative sessions with power point presentations, videos, models and discussions. Students usually are needed to write a test to check for subject matter comprehension. Certificates of completion are given upon successful completion of the class.

The use of the equipment evaluation requires the trainee to understand the job site dangers, pre-operational machine inspection, a pass/fail operational test and operational instruction.

The following subject areas will normally be covered in the training: Controls & Instrumentations; Understanding legislations and regulations; Engine maintenance and Operation; maneuvering and Steering; Visibility, Fork & Attachment Restrictions; Stability, Rated Capacities, Inspection & Maintenance; Load Control; Refueling; Dangerous Locations & Rough Terrain Operations and Pedestrians. Furthermore, there are training courses available for employees who are transitioning to new job positions.
